Secretary's Report, June 2023

Typically, the Secretary Report would bring the members up to date on two-years of ISATT activities since the previous conference.....however given the COVID-impacted years we have all just lived through, this report might seem somewhat 'out of step'. It is four years since we all gathered in Sibiu, Romania in July 2019. Today we are looking ahead to come together once again for the 20th biennial ISATT conference *ISATT 2023: Living and Leading in the Next Era: Connecting Teaching, Research, Citizenship and Equity* to be hosted by the University of Bari Aldo Moro Bari, Italy, July 3-7, 2023.

To date the ISATT 2023 scientific committee has accepted presentations from 166 individual/coauthored presentations, 18 poster presentations, and four symposia involving multiple conference delegats. Exceptionally, on this our 20th biennial conference and in celebration of the launch of the 40th ISATT Yearbook, there are 12 additional Symposia where authors of the various sections of the 40th ISATT Yearbook will present their work. The launch of the 40th ISATT Yearbook, published by Emerald in four excellent volumes will be celebrated at the conference.

In addition to the main conference, the Bari Conference Team has organized a pre-conference for graduate students commencing mid-day on Saturday, July 1st through Sunday, July 2nd. A series of workshops lead by leading scholars and researchers in teaching and teacher education will provide a generative space for doctoral students to share their own research in progress and engage with peers and experienced researchers.

As of the end of May there were over 160 delegates registered to attend ISATT although at that time we were aware of many who were about to register. We are very much looking forward to connecting in person with all the ISATT members who can attend.

While we are all looking forward to connecting in Bari in early July, I wish to congratulate Magdalena Kohout-Diaz and Marie-Christine Deyrich for their excellent organisation and warm welcome to members in October 2022 to the ISATT Regional Conference in Bordeaux, France. This was the first time ISATT has gathered in France, and it was a huge success with an inclusive and dynamic series of presentations from experienced scholars and new ISATT members. It was a welcomed treat for us all after the social isolation of 2020 and 2021.

The ISATT Executive is saying thanks and farewell to members who have served in important ways over recent years and welcome to their replacements.

- Juanjo Mena, Salamanca University, Spain, has done great work as ISATT Treasurer over the past six years which is not a simple role given ISATT's international membership. Juanjo always brings a deeply thoughtful and compassionate lens to his work in the service of ISATT members and we are very grateful for his caring insights and steady guidance essential when dealing with finances across an international membership.
