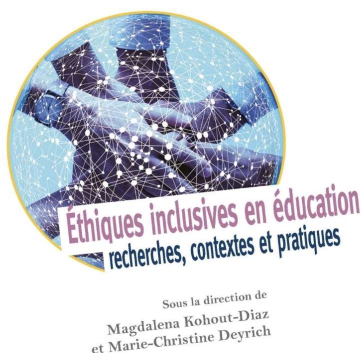

This book is structured around three main themes which examine the contours of inclusive ethics as a new educational horizon for teachers and teaching from three angles: concepts and public policies, the players in the educational community, and teachers and pupils in the inclusive classroom and school.

It looks at the developments driven by public education policies in the field of inclusive education in different countries in Europe and/or around the world. The interpretations of the guidelines proposed by the major international bodies are numerous and sometimes contradictory, given the history of special education in each specific context. How do they fit together? What are the obstacles and supporting factors? What are the innovative arrangements and how are old arrangements being revisited by the extension of the inclusive process and the ethical values that underpin it? What are the impacts on new modes of management and governance in education at national and local level? How do these principles fit in with the other priorities of public education policies?
